
Nine-Patch Quilt Pattern Quilted Wall Hanging

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American Quilt Blocks

Nine-Patch Quilt Pattern Quilted Wall Hanging

Finished Size 21"x 21"



GENERAL INFORMATION:

Creator assumes the user has basic sewing & quilting knowledge.
Adjust subcut strip lengths as needed for personal measurements.
All seams are 1/4 inch.

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

1/3 Yard Light Fabric1/2 Yard Dark Fabric (includes binding)3/4 Yard Backing Fabric

ADDITIONAL SUPPLIES NEEDED:

Sewing Machine in good working order & new needle Rotary cutting tools, mat, ruler, cutter Scissors Straight Pins

Sewing Machine Thread

CUTTING DIRECTIONS:

LIGHT FABRIC: Cut 6 strips (selvage to selvage) 1 1/2" x 44"

Subcut 1 strip: 6 - 6 1/2" pieces (sashing)
1 strip: 3 - 13 1/2" pieces (sashing)

1 strip: 2 - 15 1/2" pieces (sashing)

Remaining 3 strips will be used in full length strip sets.

DARK FABRIC: Cut 5 strips (selvage to selvage) 1 1/2" x 44"

Cut 3 strips for 90" continuous binding (strip width is personal preference)

PREPARE AND SET ASIDE:

Using full strip lengths, make 2 strip sets of dark-light-dark. (Uses 4 dark strips & 2 light strips) From <u>each</u> set cut 4 - 1 1/2" units (total of 8) for use in checkerboard and 9 patch corners. Cut remainder of stip sets in 2 - 15 1/2" border sections (total of 4).

Cut last light strip in 2 - 22" pieces and last dark strip in 1 - 22" piece. Make a light-dark-lt strip set 22" long. Subcut into 12 - 1 1/2" units for use in checker-boards and 9-patch corners. (See Diagram B)







ASSEMBLY: (See Diagram A)

- 1. Carefully peel away the backing from your printed images. Trim the white border to 1/4" from the edge of the image on all 4 sides, this is your seam allowance.
- 2. Create 4 checkerboard strips using a dark-light-dark unit and a light-dark-light unit sewn end to end (6 1/2" finished). Sew this unit to a 6 1/2" sashing strip. Press. (See Diagram B 1)
- 3. Add one of these units to each park image. See diagram A for placement. Press.





- 4. Sew top 2 images together (1 horizontal & 1 vertical) using a 6 1/2" sashing strip. Repeat for bottom 2 images. Press.
- 5. Take your 2 image pieces and add a 13 1/2" sashing piece between them. Add another 13 1/2" sashing piece to top and bottom. Next, add 15 1/2" sashing piece to both sides. Be sure to press as you go. (See Diagram A)

PIECED 9-PATCH CORNERS FOR THE BORDER:

1. Using the previously cut 1 1/2" dark-light-dark and light-dark-light units, sew the 9 patch corner units as shown in Diagram C.

ASSEMBLING THE BORDERS: (See Diagram E on back pg.)

- 1. Sew the 2 15 1/2" dark-light-dark units previously cut to the sides of the body of your wall quilt. Press with iron.
- 2. Sew the 9 patch corner block units (Diagram C) to each end of the other 2 15 1/2" dark-light-dark units. (Diagram D-1) Sew them to top and bottom of your wall quilt, matcing up the strips with the 9 patches. Press with iron. (See Diagram D)







FINISHING YOUR WALL QUILT:

 Sandwich your quilt with your choice of batt. Either hand quilt or machine quilt it in a pleasing fashion of your choice. Bind your wall quilt and you are finished! (See Diagram E on back)
